New topics for the Summer Term

Don't forget to write your numbers correctly too! A good activity is to get a paint brush and a container of water then go outside and write your numbers on the floor.

English- Our writing will be closely linked to our new topic, transport. We will develop our understanding of different types of punctuation and continue to learn new spelling rules, applying these in our independent writing.

Science- Our focus will be plants as well as living things and their habitats.

Topic- Transport

History- We will learn about different modes of transport and how these have changed over time. We will also learn about George Stephenson.

Design and Technology- We will design and make moving pictures and vehicles.
