Our Y3 pupils achieved standards in line with their peers in Reading. Our Y4, 5, 6 pupils all achieved Reading standards which were higher on average than their non-pupil premium peers. All our pupil premium children made expected or better than expected progress across the year in Reading.
Some pupils need additional support to develop secure numeracy skills; mental skills. Additional classroom support from teachers and teaching assistants to access quality first teaching.	£4,360	100% of our pupil premium children achieved expected standard in Maths at end of Y1. 100% of our pupil premium children achieved expected standard or better in Maths at end of Y2. Our 6 pupils all achieved Maths standards which were higher on average than their non-pupil premium peers. All our pupil premium children made expected or better than expected progress across the year in Maths.

Some pupils need additional support to develop and enrich their language and social interaction skills.	Language and Social Interaction support groups including resources and training for teachers and teaching assistants; Time to Talk; Black Sheep Narrative. Additional classroom support from teachers and teaching assistants to access quality first teaching.	£2,560	100% of our pupil premium children in Reception achieved expected or better in Communication and Language ELG compared to 92% of non-pupil premium children.
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Some pupils lack support from home with homework to consolidate skills in preparation for assessments.	1:1 support in preparation for Y6 assessment tests in Maths, Writing, and Reading.	£1,500	100% of our Y6 pupils achieved expected standard in their Y6 Reading, Writing and Maths tests.
Service pupils may need social and emotional support and sometimes academic support during times of transition and deployment. Some pupils need support to manage their behaviour and social and emotional issues around relationships before they can settle to make academic progress.	Positive engagement at playtime by teachers and teaching assistants and in developing roles of responsibility such as Play leaders; School Council; Eco Team; Worship Leaders. 1:1 and small group support. Low incidents of negative behaviour at playtimes and high engagement in classroom learning. This impacted positively on good progress.

Some pupil premium children with a specific interest received small group instrumental tuition.</p>
