Organising a support group for Service Children, Military Kids Club 'MKC' Heroes; liaising with Service Pupil's Champion and attending events for service children; supporting during transition to new schools, on arrival and during deployment. Ensure records and transfer information is robust. Monitor progress of Service pupils and provide academic support as required.	Teacher and TA time to communicate with parents and pupils to support transition; prepare and run weekly MKC Heroes Club. Academic support as required. Weekly MKC Heroes Club; preparation; resources; follow up and liason with class teacher = £1,000 Teaching assistant time.	Service pupils are well supported at times of transition and deployment; make good progress and achieve as well academically as their peers.
