Curriculum Letters and Topics for the term

Classes 1 and 2 are focussing on Toys over time linked to materials in science; and later in term, the country and culture of Kenya. Class 3 is studying the country of India and Class 4 is exploring the ancient Mayan culture of South America. Each class teacher has outlined other topic areas to be covered and days for class PE in the curriculum letters sent home today. Homework continues to go home on a Friday to be returned by Wednesday. Working in partnership with Durham University We once again have students training to teach on placement in school. Miss Rowe is completing a block practice in Class 2 before February half term.

<u>Instrumental Lessons</u> We currently have spaces available for small group tuition in violin or cello with Mrs Jameson. Please speak to Mrs Dobson or Mrs Newton for more information. It is also possible to have North Yorkshire music lessons for woodwind; flute, clarinet and brass. Information forms are in the office.

How can I support my child in making good progress in their learning?

Reading with your child For children of all ages - all research shows that hearing your child read, reading to them or discussing their reading with them is one the most important things you can do to ensure good progress in school. Do this everyday if possible and discuss tricky words with them.

<u>Maths and learning times tables</u> Learning times tables is an area in which you can really help your child make progress in Maths. The curriculum states that:

By the end of Year 2 children should know: x2, x5, x10 tables. eq. $2 \times 7 = 14$; $10 \div 2 = 5$

By the end of Year 3 children should also know $\times 3$, $\times 4$, $\times 8$ tables eq. $4\times 8=32$; $64\div 8=8$

By the end of Year 4 your child needs to know all their tables to x12 mixed up, with a quick response eg. 8x9=7x8=9x7=. The equivalent division bond is also important: $72\div8=56\div7=63\div9=$

If your child is in Year 5 and 6 they need to be fluent and confident in their times tables knowledge to x12 including division facts.

<u>Times Tables Rock Stars</u> all our children from Year 1 upwards have a login to this - ask your class teacher if you are unsure.

Discovery Education Espresso This is an online learning resource your child can access at home. It has a huge range of resources directly relevant to your child's learning in all areas. There is great weekly news; online safety information; games and exciting videos linked to all primary curriculum areas.
