Staff in school In addition to our regular teachers and teaching assistants, Mrs Moodie and Mrs Wright continue to provide regular supply cover. Class music lessons and string and piano teaching are delivered by Mrs Jameson who is also a fully qualified primary school teacher. Mr Waters from North Yorkshire Music Service teaches flute. Mrs Thorogood is a primary school teacher and specialist sports seach who also



is a primary school teacher and specialist sports coach who also works with us. Our clubs are run voluntarily by our school staff and by qualified sports coaches.

Mrs Butler our new school cook We welcome Jane Butler as our new school cook employed by North Yorkshire catering service. Mrs Butler comes to us as an experienced school cook and has made an excellent start getting to know all our children. After School Clubs Thank you for returning your booking forms. Confirmation slips have been sent home and clubs will start on Tuesday 10th September. If your club choice was oversubscribed you will get priority next half term.

Parent pay and School lunches If your child has moved into Year 3 you will now need to pay for their lunches, either online with Parent pay or via cheque/cash to the office, £13.75 per week. The government continues to fund lunches for infant children (until end of Y2). If you want to change your lunch arrangements the kitchen/office needs a week's notice as fresh food is ordered in advance. Please speak to the office if you think your child may qualify for free school lunches. Parent pay accounts must stay in credit.

New school laptops with Friends of School Fundraising Everyone has enjoyed logging on to our new school laptops this week. Thanks to your generous support as parents we have an additional set of new laptops. Thank you to Friends of School for organising events such as our Summer Fair and Christmas raffle.



Milk and Snacks Children in Classes 1 and 2 receive free fruit each day, funded nationally. Children under 5 receive free milk. Other children in school may also have milk daily at a small cost through Cool Milk. <u>Peanut Allergies</u> We do have children in school with peanut allergies. Please do not send your child to school with peanut butter in sandwiches or snacks.

Sports Premium Funding We value health and exercise as important to our well being and great fun too. This half term we are funding cross country and dance clubs. In lessons we have additional support to develop Reception children's fundamental skills. We aim for each child to have 2 hours of PE per week including 30 minutes of physical activity in school each day. Our children enjoy BBC Supermovers and Just Dance as ways of keeping active. Thank you to our own school staff who also teach PE and run sports clubs.

<u>Music in school</u> Instrumental lessons resume next week. If you are interested in your child having individual/small group lessons in either piano, violin, cello or flute please speak to Mrs Dobson. All children in class 3 will play either the cello or violin as part of their class music. School provides these instruments on loan, free of charge. Recorders continues to run as a Club on Friday morning.
