Reduce, Reuse, Recycle Our Eco leaders want to remind everyone that you can start bringing in tin foil, ink cartridges, batteries and crisp packets again. Please bring them into your classes. Our tin foil is taken by the Parish Open the Book Team to a recycling centre and the proceeds support Guide Dogs for the Blind. Sam and Sophie's family help us to recycle crisp packets and these are recycled by https://www.terracycle.com/ . The recycled plastic is made into watering cans, storage bins, playground equipment and surfaces, planters and much more.

Class 3's Eco/Gardening Team have created posters to display in our community which encourage people to think twice before littering our beautiful world. They have recycled milk containers by turning them into watering cans for the younger children in our school to use in their garden areas.
