This week in Class 1 we have been looking at rhymes and poems and sharing these with our class. Well done learning your rhymes for homework. We have also been preparing for our Class Assembly next week. In maths we have focussed on numbers and problem solving.

























In Maths we have been learning about money and identifying and ordering different coins. In English we have written our own version of the story 'Whatever Next'. In Science we have been learning about different animals and grouping and sorting them. We have also been preparing for our Harvest Festival and practising our Harvest song to perform in Church.















This week has been busy and exciting; the highlight was our visit to Danelaw Viking Village where we lived and worked as Vikings in our own authentic village; making clay pots, grinding corn, collecting wood, sharing Viking sagas and defending our village from Saxon attack. In Maths we have looked at Roman Numerals and positive and negative numbers.
