prepare for their Year 6 tests.



Working in partnership with Durham
University We once again have students
training to teach on placement in school.
Currently they are in Class 1 and 2 and visit every

Reading with your child For children of all ages - all research shows that hearing your child read, reading to them or discussing their reading with them is one the most important things you can do to ensure good progress in school. Do this everyday if possible and discuss tricky words with them.

<u>Maths and learning times tables</u> Learning times tables is an area in which you can really help your child make progress in Maths. The curriculum states that:

By the end of Year 2 children should know: x2, x5, x10 tables. eg. 2 x 7= 14; 10÷2=5

By the end of Year 3 children should also know x3, x4, x 8 tables eg. 4x8= 32; 64÷8=8

By the end of Year 4 your child needs to know all their tables to x12 mixed up, with a quick response eg. 8x9=7x8=9x7=. The equivalent division bond is also important: $72 \div 8 = 56 \div 7 = 63 \div 9 =$

If your child is in Year 5 and 6 they need to be fluent and confident in their times tables knowledge to x12 including division facts.

<u>Times Tables Rock Stars -</u> all our children from Year 1 upwards have a login to this - ask your class teacher if you are unsure.

<u>Discovery Education Espresso</u> This is an online learning resource your child can access at home. It has a huge range of resources directly relevant to your child's learning in all areas. There is great weekly news; online safety information; games and exciting videos linked to all primary curriculum areas.






Highlights from this week in school:
