Sweet and fruit ideas include: small cakes; fresh fruit chopped up. Drinks will be provided. **No nut products due to allergies please.** For children with allergies please speak to your child's class teacher about any concerns. **Please bring your food on a disposable plate covered in cling film if possible.**
