This week in Class 1 Mrs Reynolds has enjoyed all our Science work on seasonal change and signs of autumn. We have explored our beautiful school grounds and collected and observed signs of autumn. Everyone is making good progress with their phonics, reading and enjoyment of books. We have developed our use of colours in autumn themed art work. Reception children have had fun on our field and trim trail with their Year 6 buddies. They continue to enjoy working together in our outdoor area.

















This week in Class 2 Mrs Reynolds and Mrs Dutton have been impressed with Class 2's writing this week, especially when editing their sentences. In Maths we have continued our work on shape; recognising and naming 2d and 3d shapes and beginning to compare and sort shapes. Y1 enjoyed working outside to create triangles, squares and rectangles using natural materials. In Computing we have been learning to programme floor robots and have practiced our spellings using computer games and activities also.



After School Board Games Club Children from Class 2 along with other children in school have also been enjoying playing a variety of games together.

















This week in Class 3 we have been creating art work and portraits using fruit and vegetables in the style of Giuseppe Archimboldo. In RE we have looked at why our created world is so wonderful. Our English work on Stone Age Boy has allowed us to focus on using descriptive language for settings. In Maths we have continued our work on Place Value finding flexible ways to partition numbers. In PE we are developing our Netball skills. A great week with lots of hard work. Well done!





This week in Class 4 we have enjoyed learning about Nicholas Copernicus, a famous scientist from history. We have studied his heliocentric model with the sun at the centre of the Universe. In R.E. we have looked at the 2011 census and analysed data from the UK population reflecting on different religions and beliefs. In Art, we have used marbling as a technique to illustrate different colour and texture for our Space work inspired by the artist Peter Thorpe. In music we have learnt about Gustav Holst's Planets Suite.
