<u>Diary Dates and events coming up for the rest of this term</u> We are entering a very busy time in the school calendar. 'Treachery at Traitor's Quay' - our KS2 Summer Musical Production

Dress Rehearsal Monday 26th June when the whole school will watch the performance.

Tuesday 27th and Wednesday 28th June at 6pm in Scorton Village Hall - KS2 Summer Production 'Treachery at Traitor's Quay' This performance involves all our children in Classes 3 and 4. Class 4 children have the acting parts. Class 3 children form the Choir for this musical performance.

Tickets for the performance. Your performance tickets can be booked on Parent Pay. We are requesting £1 per ticket so that we can make a donation to the village hall and cover performance license costs. You will not receive a physical ticket.

Due to hall capacity tickets are limited. You can book a maximum of 2 tickets per night per family on Parent Pay. Please email us in school if you would like an additional ticket for either night. We will confirm this asap.

On the evenings of the performance:

All children need to be in the village hall be **5.45pm**. Class 4 children will take their costumes home on Monday after the dress rehearsal and should come to the hall dressed in their costume each evening. Class 3 children should come to the hall wearing black shorts and a plain white t shirt (or school PE shirt) for the performance evenings.

Delivering and collecting your child safely for the performances. The performance lasts approx. 1 hour. If you are not in the audience your child should be delivered to the inside of the hall by 5.45pm and collected from the entrance door just after 7pm.

Friends of the School are providing refreshments for the audience during the performance. Children should bring a water bottle.

Wednesday 12th July Summer Music Concert at 6pm in the school hall. No tickets or booking necessary. You are invited to see your child perform. (Others are welcome if you would like to share in our music in school).

This is for parents and carers of all children in Class 3 who will play their violin or cello for you.

Also for all children who have individual/small group instrumental lessons on piano, violin or cello and for all children who sing in the Choir or attend recorder club.

A reminder from Mrs Jameson to practice your pieces at home ready for the concert.

Music in School All children have Class music lessons and sing and perform especially in their Class Assemblies, at Harvest, Christmas and Easter and in the KS2 Summer Production.

Children in Class 3 learn the violin or cello for 2 years. If they wish to continue to play after this they will need to request instrumental lessons by contacting me or the office.

All children from Y1 upwards can have violin, piano or cello lessons with Mrs Jameson. There is usually a cost for this. Again please contact me or the office if you would like to know more. If your child will not be continuing instrumental lessons with Mrs Jameson in September please let us know asap.

Learning other instruments It may be possible to arrange this through North Yorkshire Music Service. Please contact me.

Around the Classes this week:

Class 1 have been learning to tell the time in Maths. In English they have enjoyed reading the fiction book, 'The Storm Whale'. They have also researched lots of fact about whales and other sea creatures and produced non-fiction writing. In Science they have repotted their tomatoes and made observations about their growth. Reception children have explored being part of a Community in RE. We are all continuing to work hard with our Reading and Phonics.

Class 2 have focused on position and direction in Maths; forwards, backwards, left, right, anti clockwise, clockwise, 1/4 and 1/2 turns. In English they have enjoyed writing their own versions of the familiar story, 'Peace at Last'. In RE Year 1 and Year 2 children all worked together to reflect on the Parable of The Good Samaritan and what this tells us about kindness to others. In Science they continue to monitor the growth of their tomato plants. In Computing they have developed programming skills using Scratch to give commands.

Class 3 are preparing to write a newspaper report in English. They have enjoyed hot seating some witnesses. In Maths they have been telling the time to 5 minutes and to the minute. In RE they explored the qualities Jesus was looking for in a disciple. In Music they are rehearing for their cello and violin performances to parents and carers at the Summer Music Concert on Wednesday 12th July. They have also been rehearing all the songs with Class 4 for the Summer Production, Treachery at Traitor's Quay.

Class 4 have been working very hard on practices for their Summer Production; developing expression and actions to create drama. They have also perfected some great two part singing. In History they have considered who was the better explorer, Shackleton or Cook. They enjoyed debating and recording their thoughts.

Activities

Our holiday club will include lots of different activities, utilising the indoor and outdoor space at the school and the beautiful village. A loose example timetable below shows what a typical day will look like:

8-9	Breakfast (if needed) – free flow outside, reading, colouring, HAMA beads etc
9-10	Walk around the village
10-12	A small snack - crafts and board games (free flow to the outdoors)
12-1	Lunch (A packed lunch will need to be provided by yourselves)
1-3	Organised games on the field (football/rounders/water fights etc)
3-3.30	A small snack (I will provide a light snack (sandwich/wraps etc)
3.30-4	Chill out time (children can bring in tech toys if they wish to use them during this time for a limited amount of time)
4-5	Free time – Free flow outdoors, indoor activities (reading/crafts etc)

Your child would need to bring a packed lunch a water bottle, sensible shoes, sun hat, sun cream, a waterproof coat, and a spare set of clothes.

We will provide sugar free drinks and healthy snacks, but feel free to bring your own too. If they have a scooter/bike, they can bring it in to use on the playground, please bring a helmet.
