<u>Letter of congratulation received as our Phonics results place our school in the top 1% of all primary</u> <u>schools in the country</u>. We were delighted to receive a letter from the Minister for Schools congratulating us on: 'your school's outstanding achievement in the 2023 Phonics Screening Check'. 'With 100% of pupils in Year 1 meeting the expected standard, **your school is in the top 1% of all primary schools in the country**.' 'Your particular success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation, from which they can become increasingly fluent and develop a lifelong love of reading.' A huge thank you to our staff and to you as parents for working in partnership with us.

<u>Y6 SATS results 2023</u> Our Year 6 children in summer 2023 also achieved exceptionally well. Nationally, 60% of children achieved the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths combined. In our school 83% of children achieved this. Nationally, 8% of children achieved at the higher standard in Reading, Writing and Maths combined. In our school 42% of children achieved at this higher standard.
