A time of Remembrance and compliments for wonderful sining at Ripon Cathedral As a whole school we took part in a formal Act of Remembrance in school. Each child and class created their own poppy wreath, we held our own 2 minutes silence, reflected, prayed, and sang a Remembrance song and the National Anthem. Congratulations to our Y5/6 Girls Football Team who have qualified for the next tournament round. They played very well at Bedale last week and were unbeaten. They finished in 2nd place overall on goal difference and as one of the top two teams they will go forward to the next round.

**In Class 1** we have learnt about Guy Fawkes and Firework safety. We enjoyed creating firework pictures and using the laptops to do this also. We made our class wreath of poppies for our Remembrance Service. In Maths we have explored shape and developed our number skills. In Science we have explored animals including humans and our role play has been visiting the vets where we are having lots of fun.









In Class 2 we have been working hard on our class assembly and enjoyed sharing all our learning with our parents and carers. In Maths we have developed our subtraction skills, learning to find the difference. In History we have learnt more about Guy Fawkes and linked this to our Firework poetry. In Design Technology we have designed a windmill and in Science we have completed our hand span investigation. We have enjoyed developing our keyboard skills on the laptops. In Geography we have looked at OS map symbols.











In Class 3 we have reflected on Armistice Day and the symbol of the poppy, creating beautiful acrostic poems. In Maths we are solving problems using formal addition methods. In RE we are learning about the Jewish Festival of Shabbat. In PE we are developing our netball skills; passing and moving and learning the importance of teamwork and communication. We also have a 'Dance' unit on Space where we are becoming astronauts and discovering a new planet. Pictured below: Netball in PE and our Y3/4 football team playing at Bedale.



Class 4 have had a busy time both in school and in wider activities. Both Y5/6 boys (pictured here) and Y5/6 Girls football teams have been representing our school. We loved performing at Ripon Cathedral and had time to visit the ancient Anglo Saxon crypt of the cathedral, dating back to 672 AD. We loved exploring underground. We also visited Crucial Crew— the North Yorkshire safety event where we learnt more about Fire, Water, Drug and Internet safety. In class we have used inverse operations to solve problems in Maths. In English we have been creating a newspaper report set in the 2nd World War. In Science we have looked at electrical safety and how to prevent fires in the home. Our new PE unit focuses on Games and Netball strategies in particular.
