<u>This week in Class 1</u> We have enjoyed completing our self portraits, using mirrors to observe carefully and then painting. Reception children have made a great start with their phonics and Year 1 are working hard with their reading. In Maths we have practiced number songs, counting forwards and backwards and ordering. Everyone loved their PE and football skills sessions with Matty and Mrs Reynolds.































In Class 2 this week We enjoyed our village walk where we identified the services Scorton has as part of our Geography work. We used google earth and aerial photos to identify areas of our school grounds for field work. In RE we discussed Christian Baptism. In PE we have developed our football skills and bat and ball skills. We have worked hard on our number work, reading and spellings. <u>In Class 3 this week</u> We were very excited to start our class music with our violins and cellos. In English we are exploring the story, Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitmura, which links with our History work, from Stone Age to Iron Age. In Maths we have been partitioning numbers up to 10,000. In Class 4 this week we have discussed why Britain entered World War 11. The children created their own radio announcement after listening to Neville Chamberlain's speech. Mr Ramsbottom was very impressed with the quality of the homework on the Second World War completed over the summer. This is now on display in Class 4. In Science we have revised the planets of the solar system. In our PE we have improved our attacking and defending skills in Tag Rugby. In our Art lesson we have been looking at imagery used to represent space themes. We are enjoying listening to our Class reader, Cosmic by Frank Cottrell-Boyce.
