Special Mentions Assembly Reminder A reminder that each Friday afternoon we meet as a whole school to celebrate and reflect on our week in school. We remember birthdays and share in the children's successes out of school also. Please do bring in or email any details about things you would like to share with us.

How can I support my child in making good progress in their learning?

Reading with your child For children of all ages - all research shows that hearing your child read, reading to them or discussing their reading with them is one the most important things you can do to ensure good progress in school. Helping them to make time at home to read is help-ful too! Do this everyday if possible and discuss tricky words and meanings with them.

<u>Maths and learning times tables</u> Learning times tables is an area in which you can really help your child make progress in Maths. The curriculum states that:

In Year 1 children should practice counting in 2's, 5's and 10's.

By the end of Year 2 children should know: x2, x5, x10 tables. eg. $2 \times 7 = 14$; $11 \times 10 = 110$.

By the end of Year 3 children should know x2, x3, x4, x5, x 8, x10 tables eg. 4x8=32; 8 x 9 =72.

By the end of Year 4 your child needs to know all their tables to x12 mixed up, with a quick response eg. 9x9=81, 7x8=56, 9x7=63.

If your child is in Year 5 and 6 they need to be fluent and confident in their times tables knowledge to x12 including division facts eg. $49 \div 7=7$, $132 \div 11 = 12$.
