<u>National Poetry Day</u> Well done to all our children who worked so hard to learn and recite their poems and rhymes in celebration of National Poetry Day. We shared some of these in our whole school assembly on Thursday and all the children shared their poems in class. Our Reception children are having fun learning lots of rhymes. Pictured below are highlights from our Poetry Assembly on Thursday.











<u>Class 4 enjoyed their visit to Richmond Castle</u> As part of their local history study of Richmond, Class 4 visited the Castle, Georgian Theatre and used OS maps and symbols to explore the town.





This week in Class 1: Mrs Reynolds says, 'this week we have explored Elmer stories by the author David McKee. We are developing our fine motor skills and Y1 children are working on their cursive handwriting. We are all enjoying reading in our Autumn themed book corner and have shared our poetry. In Maths we are focusing on counting and number rhymes, ordering numbers and finding greater than, less than and equal to.'









This week in Class 2: Mrs Smith and Mrs Dutton say, 'We have all done a fantastic job sharing the poems we learnt for National Poetry Day. In Maths we have found greater than, less than equal to; we have ordered numbers and subtracted on a number line. In Science we have identified and named common animals; fish, amphibians, reptiles and birds. We have enjoyed our computer programming work.'





This week in Class 3: Mrs Wright says, 'In English we are working hard creating our Viking story based on The Battle of the Viking Woman by Terry Deary, Our Maths work has involved adding and subtracting 1, 10, 100, 1,000 from different numbers. In PSHCE we used drama to look at problems and resolutions. In Science we investigated the question: Do marbles travel further on rough or smooth surfaces? We did a great job learning and reciting our poems for poetry day.'









This week in Class 4: Mr Ramsbottom says, 'This week Class 4 had a fantastic time exploring the rich history and Geography of our local area. We visited Richmond Castle, where we investigated how the Battle of Hastings influenced the development of our region. We explored why a castle was built in Richmond, with a particular focus on the physical geography of the area and how it made the site ideal for defence. We also enjoyed a fascinating visit to the Georgian Theatre, where we explored a timeline of its history and discussed how it has evolved over the years. To round off our local study, we took a walking tour of Richmond, using Ordnance Survey maps to identify map symbols and landmarks. It was a great hands-on activity that helped the children apply their geography skills in a real-world context.'








Holiday Club
