
Pictured below, some members of our Eco Team who created a bird identification display in the hall.


Home to school transport for Secondary Aged Pupils for many years children in Year 7 and above who attend Richmond Secondary School have been provided with free bus transport. From September 2025 Year 7 pupils travelling to Richmond School have needed to apply for a bus pass costing £818 per annum. This was because Richmond School was no longer calculated as their nearest secondary school (Risedale School was instead). **It has now come to light that distances to the nearest school were incorrectly calculated for Year 7 children living in Scorton and an appeal is being launched. If successful, this will result in children living in Scorton, once again having Richmond School designated as their nearest school and therefore receiving free transport.**


Year 1/2 Multiskills Festival Our children had great fun developing their PE skills at Richmond School last week. Well done for excellent team work and cooperation too!






In Class 1: Mrs Reynolds says: 'We are continuing to read traditional tales and have focussed on Little Red Riding Hood this week. Our Science topic is all about different materials. In Maths we have been doubling, counting and ordering numbers. In RE Year 1 children have explored the Jewish Festival of Shabbat and Reception children the parable of the Good Samaritan.'



In Class 2: Mrs Dutton and Mrs Smith say: 'Our English work on traditional tales has focussed on a character description of the big bad wolf and an alternative version of the Gingerbread Man. In Science we have looked at materials and have conducted a weather investigation. In Maths we are focussing on number and addition and subtraction. In art we are learning about colour mixing.'



In Class 3: Mrs Wright says: 'The enthusiasm has continued for our dragons as we work on our non-chronological reports in English. In Maths we have focussed on multiplication. Our Design Technology has involved creating a prototype for a sling shot car and testing how far it travelled. We enjoyed using Animate in Computing. In Science we have explored how sound travels through solid, liquid and gas. We are enjoying our Hockey.'



In Class 3: Mr Ramsbottom says: 'In Maths we have been using multiplication facts to help us with long division. In English we are developing our editing skills by redrafting our detective explanation texts. In RE we are considering 'What kind of king was Jesus?' In History we have been looking at the growth of the railways in Victorian times and its impact on Britain. In Computing we are planning our own weather reports. In Design Technology we are creating model truss bridges.'
