Highlights from this week in school:

Class 1 have explored signs of Winter in their Science work. They have discussed features of past and present in their history and worked hard to sequence and record their numbers independently. They have also been helping to lead Collective Worship—pictured below 'Jesus calls his first disciples'. They continue to work on their Drama and Music linked to Goldilocks and the Three Bears.



Class 2 recognised 2D and 3D shapes; counting sides on 2D shapes, counting vertices, drawing and creating 2D shapes on Geo boards. In English they have been reading instruction texts, identifying features and writing their own instructions. They had fun in PE and Dance marching like 'real' and 'clockwork' soldiers. In Computing they combined text and images linked to Winter.











Class 3 enjoyed researching and labelling the states of North America in their Geography work. In English their Dragon texts are progressing well. In Art they enjoyed identifying their Native American Spirit animal and researching their totem pole designs. They continue to enjoy Hockey in PE and their weekly music lessons with Mrs Jameson.







Class 4 have had a busy week focussing on fractions in Maths. In History they are studying the Victorians and have produced a timeline of key events and used historical evidence from our Victorian School log books to set national history in our local context. In Art they have researched the artist William Morris and looked at his symmetrical patterns as they prepare to try out printing techniques. In Music they are pictured below working on the features of Brahms Lullaby.
