#### Highlights from Class 1:

**Class 1** have enjoyed work on Chinese New Year and have created art work linked to their Great Fire of London topic. They have worked on traditional tales such as 'The Three Little Pigs' and Maths work on addition, subtraction and 2D and 3D shapes.





















#### Highlights from Class 2:

Year 2 girls from Class 2 had a great time developing their football skills during a fun session at Richmond School. In Maths they have worked on finding half linked to their 2 times table. In English they have written their own version of 'The Gingerbread Man'. In RE all our Y1/2 have learnt how Jews celebrate Shabbat and made a mezuzah. In Science their umbrella investigation tested materials to find out how waterproof they were.



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#### Highlights from Class 3:

**Class 3** have finished writing their Dragonolgy non-chronological reports. In Maths they have been measuring accurately using cm and mm and have looked at equivalent lengths in different units of measurement. In Geography they have identified physical and human features of North America. In Art they have designed and constructed Totem Poles. In Science they have researched the human skeleton.

**Class 4** have multiplied and divided fractions by integers; completed their mystery stories set at Kiplin Hall or the King's Head Hotel and designed and created bridges inspired by Brunel's engineering work.
