

Year 6 SATs Parents Meeting Thursday 25th January at 5pm in school This is for parents of Year 6 children; please put the date in your diary and make it a priority. We will be sharing important information on how you can best support your child, both in preparation for SATs and for the important skills they need for Secondary School.

## How can I support my child in making good progress in their learning?

**Reading with your child** For children of all ages - all research shows that hearing your child read, reading to them or discussing their reading with them is one the most important things you can do to ensure good progress in school. Do this everyday if possible and discuss tricky words with them.

<u>Maths and learning times tables</u> Learning times tables is an area in which you can really help your child make progress in Maths. The curriculum states that:

In Year 1 children should practice counting in 2's, 5's and 10's.

By the end of Year 2 children should know: x2, x5, x10 tables. eq. 2 x 7= 14; 11 x 10 = 110.

By the end of Year 3 children should know x2, x3, x4, x5, x8, x10 tables eg. 4x8 = 32;  $8 \times 9 = 72$ .

By the end of Year 4 your child needs to know all their tables to x12 mixed up, with a quick response eg. 9x9= 81, 7x8= 56, 9x7= 63.

If your child is in Year 5 and 6 they need to be fluent and confident in their times tables knowledge to x12 including division facts eg.  $49 \div 7 = 7$ ,  $132 \div 11 = 12$ .
