Enrichment:

- · Our Reception and KS1 children visit Bowes Museum to study both the History of toys and to view one of the art exhibitions. Most recently this was themed on the illustrator Raymond Briggs.
- · Our Y5/6 pupils visit Whitby Museum and Art Gallery. They also connect with local Richmond artists Mackenzie Thorpe and Lucy Pittaway.
- The Y5/6 children run a weekly lunchtime Art Club for younger children. All of this aims to inspire a life- long love of art and design.
- · We have a rich outdoor environment; trees, plants, herbs, flowers, vegetables, minibeasts and butterflies. We use this to inspire natural sculpture and observational drawing.
