Supporting Phonics and Reading at home

Decodable reading books (Collins Big Cat)

Each week, your child will be given a new book from the Collins Big Cat scheme. These books will be kept in school throughout the week, to be read by your child during reading sessions. On a Friday, your child will bring this book home to read to you. Please listen to your child read this book and record their reading in their reading record. You can simply sign to show your child has read and/or add a comment.

Other books on a coloured book band level

Your child will bring home a book from their coloured level each evening. These books are changed on a **Monday**, **Wednesday and Friday**, if completed and a note recorded in their reading record.

Library Books

We want to encourage your child to read a range of texts and enjoy reading! Every Friday, your child will be able to choose any book from our library to take home. Share these books with your child and enjoy the time you spend reading them together. When completed, please return library books to school so that your child can take a new book home.

We hope that you and your child will enjoy the range of books sent home. Please do not hesitate to contact school if you would like more clarification on supporting your child at home.

Spellings

New spellings will be given on a Monday, and children will have a chance to show what they have learnt the following Monday in small groups. Please support your child to complete three spelling attempts in their spelling book as this does help them to correctly spell during independent writing. Curriculum Coverage Summer 2024 Topic Theme: Transport

Maths

Maths lessons will cover:

- Place value
- Fractions
- Position and direction
 - Time
 - Length and height
 - Weight and volume
 - Mass, capacity and temperature
- We will continue to revisit addition, subtraction, multiplication and division and develop our problemsolving skills.

English

We will be using texts by these authors as a stimulus for our writing.

We will be continuing to focus on spelling, punctuation and grammar.

Science

RF

Creation - Who made the world? We will be retelling the story of creation from Genesis. We will think, talk and ask questions about living in an amazing world.

PE

Monday- we will be developing our cricket skills.

Tuesday- Swimming.

Art and Design

We will be using pencil to create a detailed drawing of a steam engine.

Design and Technology

We will be exploring how wheels and axles work before making our own moving vehicles.

Computing

Programming Quizzes -we will use and modify designs to create our own quiz questions in ScratchJr. In Summer 2, we will be capturing, editing and improving photos.

We will be learning how to manage online information and beginning to understand the terms copyright and ownership.

Geography

As part of our geography fieldwork, we will be conducting a traffic survey.

History
