Highlights from around the classes this week.

**<u>Class 1</u>** have been focussing on number work; place value and the important number skills for playing dominoes. They continue to look at traditional tales, especially Little Red Riding Hood. In Geography they are exploring the climate and animals of Kenya. Before half term Class 1 delivered Valentine's gifts around school.
